

Worldwide Film Weekend

Following its hugely successful premieres in London, Edinburgh, Glasgow, Los Angeles, New York and St Andrews, the University film *Ever to Excel* is being made available to alumni and friends around the world. A New Face for the Students' Association

Work has recently started on the redevelopment of the Students' Association building in St Mary's Place. The distinctive building has remained largely unchanged since it was built for a much smaller student population in the 1970s.

The revamped Students' Union will include a new entrance, a street-facing café (run for students and the public by students), and new performance areas. The current Venue One

will be split into two distinct spaces – a flexible performance space and a 600-person capacity entertainment venue, with a lounge area for an additional 270. The redevelopment will also allow for a dramatic expansion and improvement in terms of space for student societies on the middle and top floors. This will include a design suite, radio broadcasting facility and film-editing suite. On the top floor, two large flexible rooms will be introduced, both suitable for rehearsals. In keeping with University policy, the building work will be following a strict sustainability agenda throughout.

The top-to-bottom revamp (visualised above), which will be completed by the end of 2015, will cost up to £12m. Alongside central University funding, the Students' Association is contributing £750,000 to the total with the remainder to be secured through fundraising. The gift of life

A group of kind-hearted students have been recognised by NHS Blood and Transplant as their first University Organ Donation Society Partner.

The unique initiative was inspired by the tragic death of St Andrews student Alex Richardson, who created a living legacy by donating many of his organs. His mother, Annie, conceived the idea, in collaboration with the students and the NHS.

The Partnership's aims include increasing the number of young people who choose to help others by joining the NHS Organ Donor Register (ODR), as well as promoting to students the importance of discussing their wishes regarding organ donation with friends and families.

Students are running in marathons, creating a book of student writings, taking up 600-themed fitness challenges, and even auctioning their talents – all in the name of widening access to the University through the Students' Association Bursary Fund.

Helping hands



This year's Frotscher Medal for Helping Hands has been presented by the Proctor, Professor Lorna Milne, to finalyear Psychology student Fiona Burslem at a ceremony in the University of St Andrews Museum (MUSA). The medal and a cheque for £250 were awarded in recognition of the support Fiona provided to her fellow St Andrews students over the past year. Fiona has helped with Nightline and SupNet and with the coordination of the student-led Mental Wealth campaign to raise awareness of mental health issues. She also volunteers at the Cosmos Centre, helping the wider St Andrews community.

The prize, established by the family of two St Andrews students, is awarded annually to a member of staff or someone from the student community as a reward for their outstanding support of others.



Beam me up



Scottish and Czech scientists have created a miniature reallife "tractor" beam, as featured in the Star Trek movies, which for the first time allows a beam of light to attract objects, albeit at a microscopic level.

Researchers from the University of St Andrews and the Institute of Scientific Instruments (ISI), of the Czech Republic, generated a special optical field that efficiently reverses the radiation pressure of light.

Dr Tomas Cizmar (School of Medicine), along with Dr Oto Brzobohaty and Professor Pavel Zemanek (ISI), led the team which discovered a technique allowing the provision of 'negative' force acting upon minuscule particles. This could lead to more efficient medical testing, such as in the examination of blood samples.



FS2013



Once a year, St Andrews plays host to the largest student-run fashion show in the UK and enjoys coverage from popular publications, such as *Vogue* and *Tatler*. Over its 20-year history, the Fashion Show (FS) has raised over £300,000 for good causes, including paediatric epilepsy and cancer research. The event, known for showcasing famous labels alongside new design talent, has recently established the Alfa Romeo Young Designer Award to champion emerging designers.

FS 2013 chose to honour the University during its 600th Anniversary by naming the University's Wardlaw Scholarship programme as its designated charity. In addition to the annual show in St Andrews, which attracted an audience of 1,500 to Lower College Lawn, it also contributed to the Anniversary spirit by hosting a young alumni event in London.

With catwalks, live and silent auctions and a range of corporate sponsors, these events were successful in raising over £25,000 for the Wardlaw Scholarship programme.

600th Anniversary Campaign Dinner

In November 2012, a fundraising dinner was held at Middle Temple Hall, London, in support of the 600th Anniversary Fund, in the presence of the Duke and Duchess of Cambridge. The event raised over £400,000. During the evening, guests were treated to speeches by the University's Campaign Patron, the Duke of Cambridge, the Principal, Professor Louise Richardson, and two of our undergraduate students, Pamela Forbes and Kristofer Drummond. They highlighted the importance of the Sutton Trust Summer School at the University, and the thousands of generous benefactors of our scholarship programmes who help make attendance at St Andrews possible.

Making an impact

A recent independent report has demonstrated that, last year, the University contributed over £484m to the Scottish economy. It received approximately £40m in public funding from the Scottish Funding Council. This represents an increase in economic impact of £179m a year since 2008-2009. The study also looked at the 'graduate premium' – the longer-term effects of St Andrews alumni on economic productivity. The lifetime graduate premium of a single year's cohort of University graduates was £15m to the St Andrews economy.

In recently published league tables, the University has been named best in Scotland and sixth in the UK in the *Complete University Guide* 2014. The guide measures student satisfaction, research assessment, entry standards, student/staff ratio, spending on academic services, spending on student facilities, good Honours degrees achieved, and graduate prospects and completion.

St Andrews has also been ranked top in Scotland and 47th in the world in the Leiden Ranking 2013, a prestigious scientific performance ranking.

600th Anniversary Service of Thanksgiving

Over 2,400 alumni and friends gathered last December in St Paul's Cathedral in London for a spectacular Service of Thanksgiving in celebration of the University's 600th Anniversary. In the presence of Her Royal Highness The Princess Alexandra, readings were delivered by Lord Robertson, Bill Bryson, Jack Vettriano, Anna Ford, Peter Alliss and Crispin Bonham-Carter. A new work by composer Paul Mealor and commissioned by the London Alumni Club, was premiered on the evening.

Over £90,000 was raised from the proceeds of tickets, donations and a silent auction to establish the London Scholarship at the University. The Scholarship, awarded on the basis of financial need, will enable one gifted student from Greater London, who might otherwise have been unable to attend St Andrews, to fund part of the cost of their studies.



The Cathedral was a fitting venue for the Service, given that St Paul's face appears on the seal or 'bulla' attached to the 1413 papal bull granting the University of St Andrews its authority to award degrees.
