St Andrews top in new university rankings



The Complete University Guide 2024 has ranked the University of St Andrews as the top university in Scotland, and fourth in the UK.

The Guide has placed St Andrews top in the UK for student satisfaction for the fifth year running.

Success in the Guide includes Mathematics, which is now ranked in the top five in the UK – five places up from last year. There has also been a 14% increase in the number of maths students who take up graduate level employment or further study after completing their studies.

A total of 24 of the 27 subjects that are studied at St Andrews were ranked within the top ten.

Juan Pablo Rodriguez, President of the Students' Association, welcomed the news:

"Consistency of excellence in the ever-changing world of higher education is a rare gem. However, St Andrews has shown that this is possible. Remaining number one in Scotland for another year is an incredible achievement. I am proud of these results, which are a testament to the collaborative approach of the University, the Students' Association, staff and students to ensure the very best learning and teaching environment on offer."

A successful year for Saints Sport



Sport is an integral part of the student experience at St Andrews. The University's understanding of the importance of sport and its investment in the development of sport have been key factors in the achievements of many sports clubs this year. Here are just a few of these success stories.

The University of St Andrews Performance Golf Team recently won the 2023 British Universities and Colleges Sport (BUCS) National Final for the second year in succession. Saints Sport provides a supported programme for its performance golfers through golf scholarships. These provide student players with the resources they need to compete in the BUCS tournaments, in the R&A Elite Student Tour and, by invitation, in high-level tournaments in North and South America.

Meanwhile, the University's Women's Football 1s and Women's Hockey 1s have both been promoted from Scottish 1A to Premier North League. In addition, the Women's Football retained their She Can She Will Cup title for a second year in a row, while the Women's Hockey 1s won the Scottish Hockey Women's National League.

Tennis is also going from strength to strength, with the University recently being named Tennis Scotland University of the Year for the second time by the Tennis Scotland Awards. This was in recognition of the quality of the Saints Sport students' club and its record achievements, which included two promotions, a Scottish Student Sport champion title and two players reaching BUCS individual finals.

In rugby, the University has developed a new partnership with global technology company Emtelle, who have become the official partner of Saints Rugby. Through this partnership, Emtelle will support the development of the whole rugby programme at St Andrews – from grassroots to performance level – to enhance the rugby experience for all students.

Finally, the Boat Club's 60th Anniversary fundraiser raised almost £39,000 – an amazing achievement – to help them buy a new, top-end racing boat so they can compete at the highest level of UK university rowing.

'New College' progress update

'New College' - with the demolition work complete.

Work is progressing apace with the development of the first 'New College' in St Andrews in three centuries. Now that the dilapidated modern buildings to the rear of the neo-Jacobean façade and 19th-century building have been completely demolished, the site represents a rare opportunity to enhance and develop the built environment in the medieval heart of the town.

The international practice WilkinsonEyre has recently been appointed to lead the creation of 'New College' because of their unparalleled experience in transforming other heritage sites such as Battersea Power Station and the University of Oxford's Weston Library.

Their design brief is to preserve this historically important site while creating the architecture and digital infrastructure that will meet the specific needs of our students and academics. State-of-the-art technology will also ensure that the space and its environmental conditions conform to post-pandemic sensibilities and to the University's commitment to sustainability and becoming net zero by 2035.

The aerial sketch above shows the creativity and vision that will make 'New College' a stunning and sympathetic addition to the centre of our ancient town.

Alumni stories

We have had stories from many different graduates describing the impact that studying at St Andrews has had on their lives. In one of our most recent Ben Weber (MA 2004) explains how he graduated from St Andrews and spent the next 19 years living and working in China, Brazil and India before embarking on an expedition to the South Pole and then returning here to begin his PhD. We share an extract from his story here.





Journey to the ends of the earth - and back to St Andrews

On 13 January 2023, I managed to reach the South Pole. It was an exhausting journey, both physically and mentally. I skied alone across 700 miles of ice, pulling all my supplies in a sled that started off weighing 135kg, in one of the most hostile environments in the world. Winds frequently got up to gale force; temperatures on the Antarctic plateau reached down to -30C, with a windchill of -40C or worse; and even the rest days were – if I had to choose a word – intense.

I took 57 days and 10 hours to get to the Pole, and for 54 of those days I was skiing with a neck injury that I couldn't shake, which made progress much harder. I had to ski 40 miles in the final two days (with the injury becoming increasingly debilitating) or I would have missed the plane out of the continent and been stuck there for seven more days until the next scheduled flight. Not a great connection to miss! By the time I got to the Pole I was physically broken and exhausted, but absolutely elated, as this was something I had dreamed of doing since I was little. And while I graduated from St Andrews back in 2004, I am indebted to my time at the University for setting me on the path to the Pole, with all the experiences I have had during that journey.

Professor Frank Sullivan of the School of Medicine recently appeared on the BBC One prime time TV programme The One Show to discuss the pioneering Golf for Health programme, where golf is 'prescribed' for individuals to encourage a more active lifestyle.

Researchers in the School of Medicine have developed this initiative in partnership with The R&A, Fife Golf Trust, NHS Fife, Scottish Golf, PGA Scotland, the European Tour Group and Ladies European Tour to enable primary care professionals and community link workers to prescribe golf for eligible patients. The programme is being piloted in Fife.
